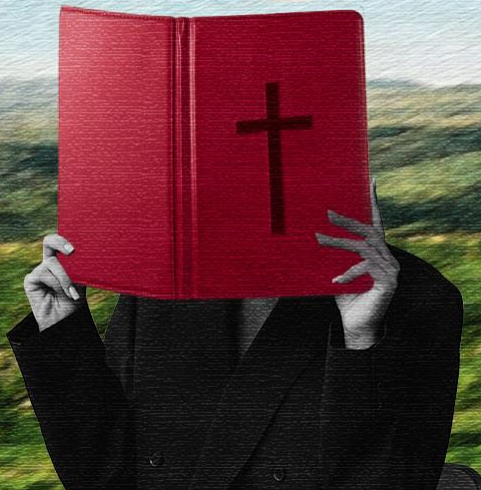

FEEDING OF THE 5000

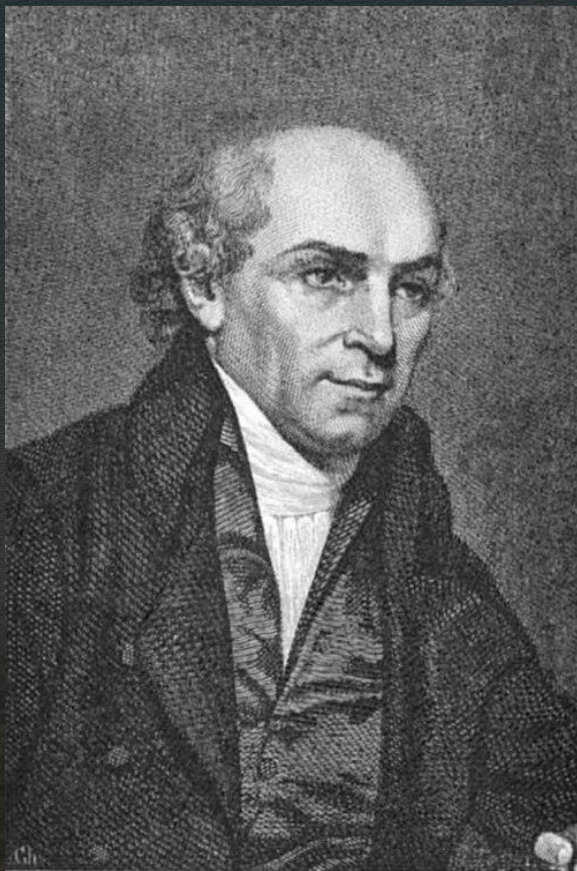
